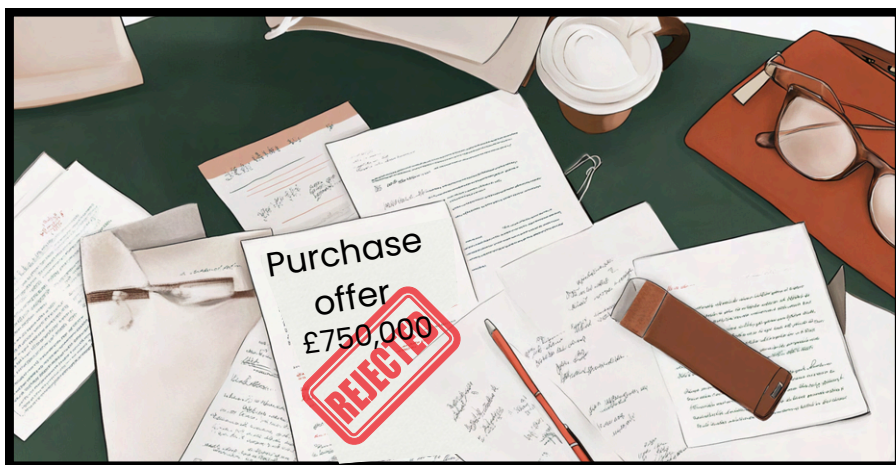
Vanishing Vanessa

She had rejected offers for the business, imagining they would mean job losses. Then she heard about EO.



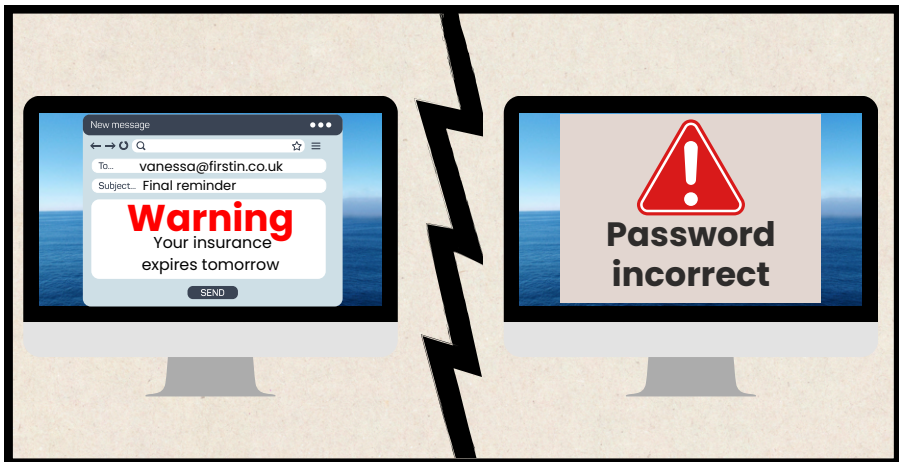
Although the senior team agreed to the transition, they were a little nervous about operating without Vanessa.

Vanessa left her laptop behind and set off on a trip of a lifetime.



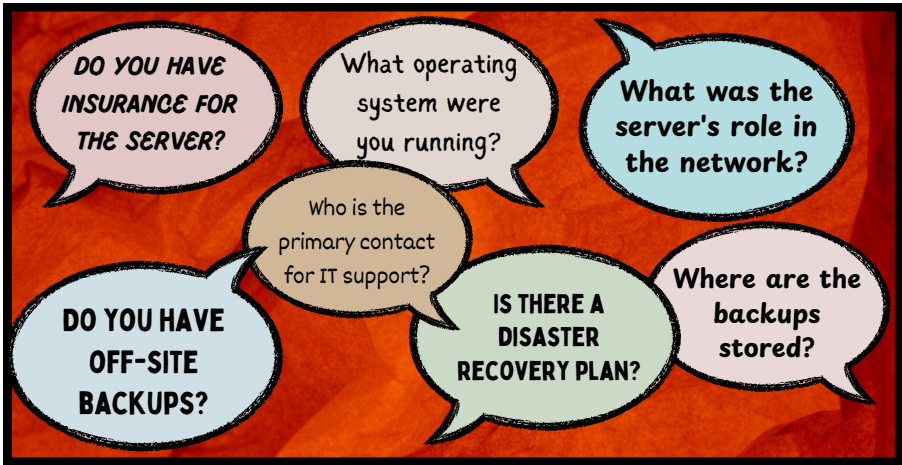
Within weeks, small issues cropped up. They were dealt with, but it took time.
